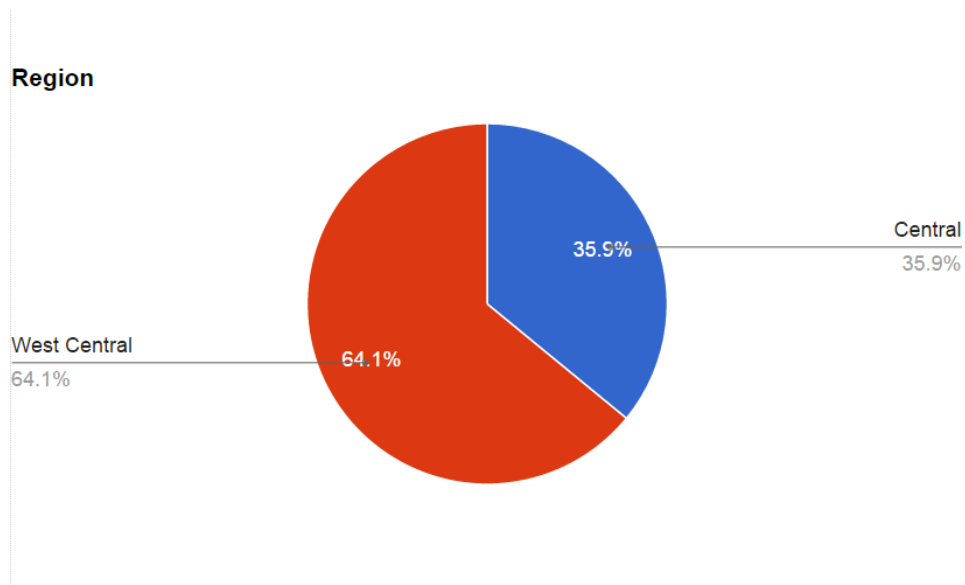

Quarter Highlights

- Coordinated and conducted Archaeology Bike Tampa (April) as a guided tour of archaeology and archaeological sites in and around downtown Tampa. The event is part of *History Bike Tampa* monthly guided rides through the city’s streets. We enjoyed it so much that we created our very own spin-off *History Bike Gainesville* and coordinated the inaugural program and tour in June.
- In conjunction with Friends of Little Salt Spring, FPAN staff coordinated a new Archaeology Works program and first to focus on a single archaeological site (not a theme or topic) titled *Archaeology Works: Little Salt Spring*. The collaborating groups utilized the event to promote the importance of the site and inform attendees of how they could advocate for its protection and preservation.
