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Assistance to DHR: Investigating a Possible Shipwreck

Earlier this year a possible shipwreck was reported to the Florida Department of Historical Resources by a local boat tour-guide in Vero Beach. The DHR contacted the FPAN East Central office and asked for assistance in investigating the report further. FPAN EC staff, including colleagues from FPAN Southeast and Southwest Regions (Rachael Kangas and Sara Ayers-Rigsby), contacted the tour-guide who offered to take the FPAN team out to dive on the site. Rachael Kangas, a certified AAUS Diver, led the underwater investigations. A preliminary report was provided to the state and further investigations will most likely occur.


