Teacher Training

Gregg conducted teacher training for the Florida Association of Science Teachers in Orlando in October during their annual conference; provided instruction on classroom activities and FPAN resources.

Assisting DHR/UCF Internship

We sponsored our first intern this past semester, Patty Goodson, who compiled a database of all historic cemeteries in Brevard County that have not been listed in the Florida Master Site File, so that we may complete the documentation and assessment necessary to have them listed. Gregg and Patty added seven new cemeteries to the FMSF during the course of the internship.

Past and Upcoming Events

We have begun our spring "In the Dirt" series, which featured Dr. John Schultz, a forensic anthropologist from the University of Central Florida, who discussed the use of human remains in solving crimes. Dr. Schultz also discussed his recent work on the Casey Anthony trial.

Our series will feature a spectacular lineup this semester. In February, Dr. Ken Sassaman will discuss his work on ancient shell cities along the northern Gulf Coast; in March, Dr. Keith Ashley will discuss his work on the Mocama-speaking Timucuan; and in April, Dr. Neill Wallis from the Florida Museum of Natural History will discuss Pre-Columbian communication networks. We will also be featuring the artwork of Theodore Morris, who captures daily life images of Calusa and Timucuan natives as part of our Gallery Walk in April.

We are planning a 30-Year Anniversary event celebrating the discovery of the Windover site, which will coincide with the release of my next book, *Life and Death at Windover: Excavations of a 7,000-year-old Pond Cemetery.* The event will be held on March 31, just in time for Archaeology Month!
