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Executive Summary

During the fourth quarter the Northeast Center participated in a range of professional conferences and regional outreach events. Summer began with an ambitious schedule of multiple teacher training workshops, summer camps, and assisting sister centers with programing. End of the quarter efforts focused on finishing the *Timucuan Technology* Community Education project; publishing 10 new lessons written by consultant Kelley Weitzel and facilitating a teacher workshop. Lessons will be available in print as well as on line free of charge. The workshop was a success with registrants from each of our seven counties in the northeast, the majority from our target audience of middle school science teachers. Materials compiled for the program will continue to benefit the region in the form of interpretive panels, blog posts, and mini-workshops for the public.
