The Northwest Region ended its summer with a bang this year by partnering with organizations across the region and our host institution, the University of West Florida. In July, FPAN Northwest worked with Gulf Islands National Seashore to put on our annual Summer Lecture Series. Talks took place each Tuesday during the month of July and featured speakers on local history and archaeology from the FPAN Coordinating Center, FPAN Northwest, and the University of West Florida's Division of Anthropology and Archaeology. FPAN Northwest also welcomed Katherine Sims, its newest intern, in August. Katherine is pursuing her Master's degree in Historical Archaeology at the University of West Florida and will be assisting FPAN's outreach and education efforts over the next three years.
