Quarterly Report – October/November/December 2011

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Executive Summary

Fall is festival and conference season and FPAN Northwest showed the flag throughout the region! September and October brings beautiful weather to the Panhandle and many of our regional partners host festivals and outdoor events in which we are pleased to participate. Rocky Bayou State Park in Niceville hosts an annual Pioneer Day to celebrate local history and heritage; the FPAN booth this year saw over 300 attendees stop by to learn more and to try their hand at archaeological activities. Arcadia Mill Archaeological Site in Milton, one of our most active partners, collaborated with FPAN again to organize and host a lecture series as part of Santa Rosa County's Beaches to Woodlands tour. Beaches to Woodlands is intended to draw local folks to Santa Rosa County for everything from corn mazes to berry picking to farmer's markets to nature trails. Arcadia Mill's lecture series focuses on "Secrets of Santa Rosa: Archaeology and History in Your Backyard" and has proven to draw good crowds to the Mill. The Washington County Historical Museum in Chipley hosted Fall Into History and FPAN staff met with 113 attendees. Irina and Della attended the annual Diving Equipment & Marketing Association (DEMA) trade show, the largest show for the scuba diving industry. Along with staff from the West Central Region and volunteers, we spoke to over 900 attendees, handing out literature on Florida's Underwater Archaeological Preserves and Maritime Heritage Trail, as well as flyers for the Heritage Awareness Diving Seminar and the new Submerged Sites Education & Archaeological Stewardship (SSEAS) programs. Several FPAN regions hosted booths at the Public Day for the Southeastern Archaeological Society conference in Jacksonville, and the Northwest Region booth had over 100 visitors.

FPAN and UWF staff responded to a request for a meeting by the local Army Corps of Engineers office. They requested assistance in training their staff to recognize and protect cultural resources in their jurisdiction, both on land and underwater. The first step is hosting informal training lectures to educate COE staff about the types of resources they're likely to encounter, where they're located, and what to do about them. The first lecture was hosted in December, where staff from COE as well as the Northwest Florida Water Management District, and Department of Environmental Protection had an Introduction to Underwater Archaeology and learned about

Shipwrecks of Pensacola Bay. Response was exciting and encouraging and the next lecture is being planned for January to discuss law affecting cultural resources.
