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Executive Summary

The spring has seen FPAN Northwest staff providing a variety of programming. Our professional colleagues at the Society for American Archaeology conference heard about the SSEAS program and many stopped by the FPAN booth in the bookroom where the Beyond Artifacts publication proved especially popular with nearly 100 requests. Closer to home, Falling Waters State Park's annual Legends & Lore event brought hundreds of local schoolchildren and their teachers, as well as general visitors, to learn about archaeology in the panhandle. Because of budget cuts affecting school field trips, this year's event was especially large as local teachers chose Legends & Lore as their one trip for the year, thus proving yet again the value of partnerships among regional heritage organizations. The Heritage Awareness Diving Seminar, held in the Southeast Region, brought diving leadership from all over Florida and as far away as Michigan and Trinidad! The class was full once again, with more people on the wait list for next year. The annual History & Archaeology Summer Camp, in partnership with West Florida Historic Preservation, Inc., was held for upcoming 4th through 6th graders and was full of campers. The second part of camp, for upcoming 7th through 9th graders. will be held later in the summer. An intensive summer school program in Holmes County, visiting five schools in two days to do intro to archaeology programs and the cookie excavation activity, enabled us to contact this very rural county and encourage teachers to attend workshops and other programs.

The Milton High School Scott Site program ended another successful year. A Media Event/VIP Day was held and very well attended with local dignitaries, including Milton's Mayor and several County and City officials, visiting the site and complementing the students on their work. A descendant of the Bahan family, who originally owned the brickyard, also attended, driving all the way from Indiana to see the project. Milton High School is committed to continuing the program and we will work with them to make it happen. Although the graduate student who was working with them is no longer in school, an FPAN Intern will take over until another graduate student can be identified as a leader and researcher for the project.
