Assistance to Local Governments: Collections in Palm Beach County

This August and September, FPAN SE staff developed a program to train and assist volunteers in the county in up-to-date collections management procedures, in order to facilitate the county's curation of collections originally housed by the Morikami Museum. To this end, Ms. Fenn, Ms. Scott and Ms. Gravlin-Beman developed a system for managing the collection and trained county volunteers and interns in file management, accessioning, and artifact photography. With many collections receiving various levels of care throughout the state, developing a standardized program to train volunteers in collections care and management is critical.

Assistance to the DHR: The Miami Circle and Beyond
