Highlight of the Quarter

The 2013 Florida Archaeology Month was very successful in southeast Florida. We participated in a total of fifteen lectures, events, and related activities in Palm Beach, Broward, Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties. These efforts allowed us to introduce over 2,700 people to the missions and goals of FPAN. In addition, we distributed approximately 800 FAM posters to our FAS chapters and to the Florida State Parks within our region.

Progress on Work Plan Objectives Public Outreach

- Offered a total of fifteen public lectures at venues across our region
- Participated in four youth activities in Broward and Miami-Dade Counties.
- Judged National History Day entries for Palm Beach County Schools
- Completed 24 workdays at Lawrence E. Will Museum of the Glades
- Actively maintained Twitter feeds, FaceBook page, Viva 500, FAM, and FPAN websites/databases
- Served on boards for Broward Trust for Historic Preservation, Broward County Historical Commission and Florida Archaeological Council
- Completed Palm Beach Teacher Training in collaboration with John MacArthur State Park.
- Planned 2013 Educator Trainings with John MacArthur State Park, West Palm Beach Historical Society, and Broward NatureScape
- Loaned panels from "Then and Now" exhibit to Broward County Libraries for display
- Awarded SEAC Public Outreach Grant for "The Misadventures of Sandy Trowels." Text
