

West Central Regional Center Quarterly Report – April-June 2010 Jeff Moates, Director Rae Harper, Outreach Coordinator Zaida Darley, Outreach Specialist

Executive Summary

West Central Regional Center staff continued on a busy clip of outreach effort in the Tampa Bay region during the April – June 2010 quarter. In total, WCRC staff participated in 38 various outreach events/presentations and attended 9 meetings with regional partners in the preservation, education, and government sectors.

Staff efforts this quarter concentrated on several education and outreach programs. Staff coordinated a professional panel discussion titled *Local Governments in Reach: Discussing Preservation* for the annual meetings and conference of the Florida Anthropological Society (FAS) in Ft. Myers, FL. *Rancho Regattas 2010*, an outreach program developed by staff that highlighted the Gulf Coast's maritime heritage through Cuban Fishing Ranchos, culminated in three separate events throughout the quarter. Each event consisted of public presentations and related educational activities to traditional boating and fishing. A travelling museum exhibit also accompanied each event.

Additionally, the FPAN/USF collaborative effort with the undergraduate internship program took off this quarter providing assistance to the Hillsborough County Conservation Lands Department. These efforts helped in the recording of archaeological and historic sites within conservation lands. Staff assisted undergrads in the recording and documenting of four new sites. Undergrads created FMSF field and site reports and submitted them to USF faculty in the Dept. of Anthropology to receive college credit for the internship.

WCRC staff involved undergrads and volunteers in another project that is focusing on the rehabilitation of an "orphaned" cemetery in Hillsborough County. In collaboration with the citizen-led Samford Cemetery group, this effort also comes out of a request from the Historic Resources Review Board for Hillsborough County. The board asked WCRC staff to assess the cemetery and current efforts by citizen group while county staff tries to determine ownership status and county responsibility in its upkeep and access. Efforts are ongoing. Three other "orphaned" cemeteries in Hillsborough County have been brought to the attention of the HRRB.

Led by Outreach Coordinator Rae Harper, staff visited 7 different schools in all and also coordinated an afterschool program at Weedon Island Cultural and Natural History Center (Pinellas County) based on the new *Project Archaeology* curriculum, "Investigating Shelter." Staff conducted the program twice per month. It has been a wonderful success as a formal partnership with the Weedon Island Center and as it showcased many repeat customers.

Staff also started a neighborhood archaeology project this quarter in the Driftwood neighborhood located in south St. Petersburg (Pinellas Co). Driftwood residents contacted staff along with representatives of a local FAS chapter, Central Gulf Coast Archaeological Society (CGCAS) in December of 2009. Upon initial and subsequent meetings in the neighborhood, the Driftwood folks requested that our groups conduct a neighborhood-wide archaeological survey. The Driftwood Neighborhood itself is a 1930s development with over 30 custom-built houses comprising the original neighborhood design. However, the area where Driftwood is located also boasts an 1850s homestead and the founding of the first incorporated settlement on the Pinellas peninsula, known as Pinellas Village (1870s).

In June, WCRC staff initiated a phase I archaeological survey with help from a USF summer fieldschool in archaeology under the direction of Dr. Brent Weisman. The survey has continued and presents opportunities for volunteers, members of CGCAS, and residents of Driftwood to participate in such an endeavor. More on this work in the next quarterly report.
